

GOOD EVENING LADIES AND GENTLEMEN

I am delighted to welcome you to West End Bares' 10th anniversary party, Stripped!

In 2009, following discussions with Jerry Mitchell, the creator of *Broadway Bares*, TheatreMAD produced its very first *West End Bares: Strip Britannia*, under the artistic direction of Darren Carnell. Opening at the celebrated Café de Paris in 2009, the show went from strength to strength. This year, 2019, the legendary Troxy is the home for what will be an amazing celebration of ten years of *West End Bares* and a tribute to all of the incredible people who have supported the show over the years.

As well as having a fantastic evening of fun and frivolity, I hope you will all take a moment to reflect on why the Make A Difference Trust and all our wonderful volunteers work so hard to continue to raise funds for HIV/AIDS. For those of you who aren't familiar with the MAD Trust, we have been raising funds for HIV/AIDS for 30 years.

Thankfully, the HIV landscape has changed dramatically since we first began raising funds. The UK is one of the first countries to reach the UNAIDS 90-90-90 target: 90% of people know their status, 90% receiving antiretroviral therapy, 90% with viral suppression. Knowing your status and receiving early treatment is key to defeating the disease. U=U: Undetectable = Untransmittable.

But sadly that is not reflected everywhere. Every 30 seconds, someone somewhere in the world dies of an AIDS related illness. There are 2.1 million children living with HIV worldwide, 57% of whom do not have access to treatment. We continue to work with our partners in Sub-Saharan Africa to provide education and support for children living with or affected by HIV.

Even here in the UK it isn't all good news. 8% are unaware of their infection, so it is vital that people seek an HIV test if at risk. In 2017, 43% of diagnoses were made at a late stage of infection. Late diagnosis is associated with a tenfold increased risk of death with one year of diagnosis.

For this reason, this year has seen the launch of the MAD Trust's *No Drama* programme, which offers free home self-test kits to members of the theatre community and the continuation of our Peer to Peer support programme for those newly-diagnosed or living with HIV. It is a small way to support those who support our fundraising, as all the funds we raise are through the generosity of time, spirit and talent of the theatre industry. Everyone who is involved in our events from makeup to dancers, lighting to directors all give their time as volunteers.

We work with our partners both in the UK and Sub-Saharan Africa on HIV projects that build awareness, and provide care support and education.

For the MAD Trust, raising awareness and education, particularly for young people, is key to a better understanding of HIV; understanding its impact on individuals, understanding the stigma and prejudice that can be encountered, and understanding the importance of testing and early diagnosis.

Our education through theatre programme, *Are You Positive?*, is performed in drama schools across London, informing and educating young people about the virus, and its impact continues. The success of the project was summed up by the comment of one of the students: 'It is inspirational to see what people can do within the theatre industry, and the power that education and understanding can bring.'

We hope to continue and to extend the programme so that it will become a part of the timetable in all drama schools.

All of the work we do is only made possible by the continued support and commitment of all the wonderful people from the theatre industry; so to everyone who has been a part of the journey of *West End Bares* over the last ten years, and everyone who has helped to make this evening possible, thank you. Two small words for making a difference to the lives of many.

I would like to welcome each and every one of you to tonight's show. Welcome to those of you who are new to *West End Bares*, and to those of you who are returning, welcome back. By being here tonight, we are all one step closer to making a difference, one step closer to a world free of HIV/AIDS.

Enjoy the celebrations, have a wonderful evening, and thank you for helping us make a difference to people's lives.

IT'S TIME TO GO FULLOUT!



25 YEARS OF GIVING A GLAM

M-A-C Global Senior Artist
Dominic Skinner celebrates
a perfect pairing with Bares
as Viva Glam turns 25

Tell us a bit about what you do for M·A·C and your journey to get where you are today?

I am one of their Global Senior Artists. This means I do a whole host of different things. Mostly I am a spokesperson for the brand but you can also find me working backstage at various Fashion Weeks, writing quotes for magazines, hosting Masterclasses, working on photoshoots or designing looks for theatre productions.

I got into makeup by chance, really. While at art school, I started to incorporate makeup into some of my work. Soon friends asked me to do makeup for their projects and, after a while, I found myself enjoying the process of makeup more than anything else. After graduating from London College of Fashion with a degree in makeup, I got a part time job at M·A·C. That was over 15 years ago now and during that time I worked my way up to become a Global Senior Artist.

When did you know you wanted to be an MUA?

Becoming a makeup artist was never on the cards for me. I wanted to be an artist living in Paris in a drafty loft apartment. However, the reality was never going to be as romantic as the idea. Though makeup became something I fell in love with at art school, when I look back, I think it was when I watched Daryl Hannah spray her eye black in *Blade Runner* that I first noticed makeup as a powerful creative medium. Then growing up with magazines like The Face cemented my belief that makeup is a true art form that can tell a story and convey a character.

How long have you been involved with West End Bares (WEB) and the Make a Difference Trust?

Though I've been heavily involved with *West End Bares* for the past five years, I have worked as part of the makeup team backstage since the beginning. I'm most proud of being the lead makeup artist for *WEB* for the last two years. This means I've designed all the looks, organised the army of makeup artists backstage and checked off each and every look before it hits the stage.

What keeps you coming back each year?

WEB is the most fun event I have the privilege to work on each year. It really is the highlight. The team that organises the show work so hard and are so dedicated, and it really shows in the high

quality of the performance. The collaboration between choreographers, art directors, styling, hair and makeup is seamless. Everyone just wants to put on the best show and do it all for the Make A Difference Trust. It's more than just a passion project, it's a blood, sweat and giggles project too.

Describe what happens the day before the curtain goes up?

The whole makeup team meets around 9am to set up. We normally have a team of around 20 artists and they get spilt into four groups. Around 9:30am, we have a briefing to explain the running of the day, go through all the looks, inspiration and products.

We work throughout the day with a short pit stop at 6pm, when the pizza arrives, and by 8pm all the makeups are completed.

In between all this, 20 extremely talented makeup artists have created looks for over 110 incredible West End performers, varying from simple beauty to full on glam and top to toe body paint. I sometimes look back and wonder how on earth we did it, but I couldn't be more grateful to everyone that works so hard to get it done.

Why do you think M·A·C and the Make a Difference Trust are such a good match?

M·A·C is all about artistry. We celebrate art, creativity and talent above all other things. Plus, with our Viva Glam campaign at the very soul of our brand, it just makes so much sense that we support the Make A Difference Trust, who use art, creativity and talent within the West End to do so much good for others.

What's been your favourite look from all the editions of WEB you've been involved with and why?

It's so hard to pick just one because each year I'm so inspired by the theme. However, if you force me to make a choice I would say the big black kiss prints that we body painted for the performance of Prince's 'Kiss' at last year's *Top Off The Pops*. It was so simple but so effective. Though after tonight, this might change. We have some pretty special looks coming up in tonight's 10-year anniversary show. So keep an eye out!



If you could choose the theme for next year's show, what would it be? What looks would you create?

Ooh, this is a tough one. Every year, I'm blown away by the theme that is thought up and wonder how it's never been done before.

I think if I could choose the theme I'd say science fiction. Lasers, robots, aliens and a ton of glitter of course.

What's your go-to makeup tip that should never be missed?

Never underestimate the power of a well-groomed brow. If you brush your brows up it can give you that lift that can take years off. It works. I promise.

We're delighted to be sharing our birthday with the iconic Viva Glam lipstick, which turns 25 this year. Will you be using the limited edition version in tonight's show?

We will most definitely be using the Viva Glam lipstick in the show. There are a few numbers that feature a red lipstick and each time it will be Viva Glam, for sure. Not only is it a fabulous red that suits EVERY skin tone, but the full RRP (less VAT) will be donated to many great causes.

PEER SUPPORT

We are continuing our Peer to Peer Support programme or members of the theatre community newly diagnosed or may with HIV. Testing positive can be a daunting challenge, you may feel overwhelmed, fearful and alone. Peer to Peer support ensures that you are far from alone. If you are living with HIV you may need help managing treatments, dealing with sex and relationships, feeling better about yourself, or you may just want someone to talk to this service was created to assist with all these challenges. The MAD Trust is honoured to have been nominated for an Industry Mind Award for Establishment of the Year (an establishment in the creative arts who are bettering mental health and wellbeing).

ARE YOU POSITIVE THEATRE DRAMA SHOOL PROGRAMME

Our other in-house initiative is expanding Are You Positive, our education through theatre programme into drama schools. It is a theatrical production raising awareness about HIV and AIDS.

The play deals with how each of the characters are affected by HIV and AIDS, their stories interspersed with facts about HIV and AIDS; this helps to promote a deeper understanding and helps clarify the myths surrounding the virus. Are You Positive supports young adults in learning how to communicate with a partner regarding sexual health and protection and aims to break the stigma often associated with being open about being HIV positive.

We continued our support of Ubuntu Pathways - Cradle to Career programme in Port Elizabeth, South Africa and funded The Magnet Theatre project in Siaya County, Kenya, a pilot to test the effect of community theatre in getting young people to understand HIV, the importance of being tested, the benefits of early detection in effective treatment, raising awareness and understanding of sexual health and sexuality. One of the most exciting international projects this year was building a medical centre in Uganda.

The Make A Difference continued to fund the CHIVA Freedom to Be Camp, a residential support intervention offering the opportunity for 100 children growing up with HIV in the UK to attend; we supported NAM's AIDS Map Live, that produced and broadcast a live broadcast panel discussion event with a target audience of 5,000 people, focussing on emotional wellbeing and mental health for people living with HIV. Other grants included:

CHELSEA AND WESTMINSTER HOSPITAL

The Grass is Always Grindr (Season 2), an HIV/Aids education and awareness project

Together with 56 Dean Street, we produced 'The Grass Is Always Grindr', a web series developed to reinforce PRIME's key risk reduction messages with 56 Dean Street and The Chelsea and Westminster Hospital.









FOOD CHAIN

We supported Food Chains' enhanced food and nutrition services for people living with HIV in crisis programmes. The project provides essential support to people living with HIV in times of nutritional crisis. It will offer a package of care to 35 vulnerable people living with HIV, including 100 hours of dietic advice, 105 emergency grocery deliveries, 12 communal lunches,

CHILDREN OF UGANDA

Medical Centre for the vulnerable children and villagers of Butansi, in SE Uganda

The Make A Difference Trust is very proud to have funded a medical clinic which will treat the adults and children who are HIV positive, malaria & other common, but treatable diseases. The Medical Centre will provide a much needed clinic for the adults and children suffering from HIV and other prevalent diseases, such as malaria, mumps, skin infections, etc. It will importantly provide ongoing preventative healthcare, before the children get so ill that they have to make the long trek to the nearest hospital – a two-hour walk! The Centre will also cater for the social welfare of the community – offering professional advice and sex education to the teenagers, as well as helping with




abuse and other social issues within the community. The Centre will also provide educational facilities – in the form of Adult Education Classes, after school study rooms with electricity, a library and IT and computer centre.
